Circuit Meeting Secretary Vacancy

Our lovely Circuit Meeting Secretary, Gwen, will be stepping down following the Circuit Meeting on Thursday next week. We are very grateful to Gwen for her service to the Circuit over the past few years.

The Primary role of the Circuit Meeting Secretary is to support the Superintendent in preparing for and conducting the Circuit Meeting, working closely with the Superintendent and the Circuit Administrator. Meetings are usually twice a year, March and September with occasional extra meetings. Some of the administrative duties of the Circuit Meeting Secretary have been delegated to the Circuit Administrator therefore liaison with the Circuit Office will be required.

A knowledge of the mission and ministry of the Hinckley Methodist Circuit is essential, and the person appointed must be a member of the Methodist Church, well organised and an effective communicator. Previous experience as a Church Council or Circuit Meeting Secretary would be useful.

Appointment is by the Circuit Meeting for one year, for a maximum of 6 successive years.

Contact the Circuit Office for a role description, or speak to the Circuit Superintendent if you are interested in this role. We are hoping to appoint someone at the forthcoming Circuit Meeting next week

The role is unpaid, but reasonable expenses will be reimbursed.

What is Wishcycling?

Definition: Wishcycling is the practice of putting items in a recycling bin without being certain they are actually recyclable, often with the hope that they will be processed.

Why it's a problem:

- Contamination: Non-recyclable items can contaminate the entire recycling stream, making it unusable for processing.
- Increased waste: Contaminated recycling often ends up in landfills instead of being processed.
- Difficult sorting: Wishcycling makes it harder and more expensive for recycling facilities to sort and process materials.

Examples of common wishcycling items:

- Plastic bags, wrappers, and cling film
- Food-contaminated containers
- Foil pouches
- Styrofoam
- Coffee pods
- Batteries
- Certain types of plastic packaging

How to avoid wishcycling:

- Check local recycling guidelines: Ensure you know what materials are accepted in your area.
- Rinse containers: Make sure containers are clean before placing them in the recycling bin.
- Be aware of common contaminants: Avoid putting non-recyclable items in the recycling bin.
- If in doubt, throw it out: If you're unsure whether an item is recyclable, it's best to dispose of it in the rubbish.

Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council provide information about local recycling rules on their website <u>HBBC recycling</u>. If you ensure about any item, you can send an enquiry via the HBBC contact page.
